ALL SCHOOL SERVICE DAY

On Friday, April 15, 2011, Notre Dame will be participating in an All-School Community Service Day from 8:30 to 11:30 am. This project is consistent with our Mercy mission and provides a way for students, faculty and staff to give back to our community by improving the beauty and safety of the Chemung River, Eldridge Park fields and lake, Downtown Elmira and Wisner Park, as well as allowing us all to give something back to our community while enjoying nature and the outdoors. Educationally, it is hoped that the students will come to understand the responsibility and importance of environmental stewardship, all the while instilling in everyone a sense of community and ownership in our town and the surrounding area.

This special and unique day will include five groups of forty to fifty people composed of the Notre Dame Community and volunteers of the River Friends Group. They will clean trash from boat launches, river trails, levees and public parks along the Chemung River, Downtown Elmira and Eldridge Park. A smaller group will paint and seal the picnic pavilion at the Grove Street landing.

On the Thursday prior to the event, there will be a fifteen minute assembly where Jim Pffiffer will explain the importance of this clean-up. Students will bring a permission slip home that needs to be approved by parents for their participation in the event.

SERVICE LEARNING CLASS

Congratulations to Mrs. Jennifer Roberts-O'Brian and her Service Learning Class. They have formed a partnership with the Alternative High School in Elmira as part of their class to implement the national anti-hunger program for teen parents. Members of the class have been most interested in delivering the curriculum to teen parents, but found that teens are the toughest population to get to come to the evening classes. Thus, Mrs. Roberts-O'Brian arranged to bring the curriculum to them at the Alternative High School so her students could deliver the program. During the month of April and May she will escort her students to the Alternative High School where they will be joined by a nutritionist from Cornell Cooperative Extension and Chef Todd McClelland to instruct a group of 8-10 students as part of their health class.

ROBOTICS TEAM ADVANCES

Weeks of intense hard work and dedication resulted in reward for the *FIRST* Robotics Team 3799 of Notre Dame High School. The team, accompanied by their advisor, **Mr. Charles Berry**, earned a place in the *FIRST* Championship in St. Louis, Missouri April 27-30, 2011. They did this by winning the ROOKIE ALL-STAR AWARD at the Finger Lakes Regional Competition at RIT in Rochester, March 3-5, 2011. This award celebrates "a rookie team for outstanding effort as a *FIRST* team in community outreach and recruiting students to engineering". The team also received the Highest Rookie Seed Award. There were forty-four teams in the regional competition and four of them were rookie teams. The Notre Dame High School team is the only rookie team that made it to the final round of competition and earning them a 6th place finish out of the forty-four teams.

The team is especially grateful to all of their mentors. They have high praise for **Scott Deming, Jeff Domey, KR Liu, Kevin Ashton, Jason Knapp, J.P. Perino and Tom Gustin** who have given much of their time and expert advice. Scott Deming states, "I have been involved in robotics at Corning since 1983 and have many interests in this area. The *FIRST* Robotics program is an excellent opportunity for high school students to learn about the science and technology of designing and building robots. The knowledge and experience they pick up from participating in the program is an excellent foundation for students aspiring to be future engineers and scientists. In addition to the technical aspects of the program it also teaches the students about teamwork, business, finance, computer science and many other things."

Danielle Samter and **Anna Knapp** were the drivers and initiators of the first robotics team at Notre Dame and both were very enthusiastic about the development of the project and the event in Rochester. They are looking forward to the Championship in Saint Louis. Danielle Samter reported "going to the event proved to be better than I ever imagined, not only did I make many new friends, but it increased the sense of empow-

erment I have received from working on the team". **Anna Knapp**, the other team leader said, "It was great to see that all the time spent working paid-off. The competition was full of energy – like a nerdy rock concert – and it was rewarding to see the Robot working well. I felt the support of all the other teams and cheered them on as well".

Jasper Perino, the team's MVP was very involved in the project from the beginning and he thought the opportunity to be a part of Notre Dame's *FIRST* Robotics team has been an amazing experience. He said, "Having the chance to learn from our team's mentors has been a dream come true. Winning the Rookie All Star Award and the Highest Rookie Seed Award did not come easy and it was a great reward for all of our hard work".

International Exchange Program

Notre Dame has entered into a partnership with the Cambridge Institute of Chinese Business Research (CICBR) in recruiting students from mainland China. CICBR has a well staffed American home office in the Boston area and offices in several major Chinese cities (Beijing, Shanghai, Shenzhen and Zhengzhou). Our school hopes to have five Chinese students during the 2011-2012 school-year who will matriculate for three years. Other schools who have used this organization have reported that the Chinese students that CICBR has helped make a part of their school bring a great work ethic and a global perspective to the school community. We are anxious to have host families who are willing to welcome a student into their home. If any families are interested please contact Sister Nancy Kelly who is helping to arrange these home stays.

Pro Life Conference

Saturday, April 9, 2011 from noon until 5 pm, there will be a conference for high school and college students at the University of Rochester. This Pro-Life Conference will include speakers, workshops, hands on projects and social time. Participants will be coming from Buffalo, Syracuse and all points in between. Topics will include "The Scientific Proof of the Life Beginning at Conception", "What Can I Do If I Find Out a Friend is Pregnant" and a personal account of post-abortion trauma. AP English

Recently, the students in Mr. Pucci's AP English classes had a rare opportunity to interact with Maxine Kumin, a winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Poetry. Ms. Kumin, who is retired and lives in New Hampshire, sent Mr. Pucci a copy of her essay, "A Very Old Formalist," in which she shares her development as a poet and her close friendship with fellow poet, Anne Sexton. 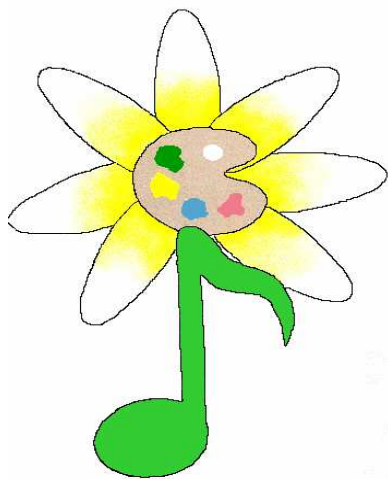

EGG DROP COMPETITION RULES

Time to test your skills in protecting an egg from being dropped!
Your mission (should you choose to accept it) is to design a container that will protect a raw egg when dropped from the top of the ND stadium!
The person whose egg can withstand the largest drop will be declared the winner!

Rules

The container can be of any design, but may NOT include standard packaging materials (bubble wrap, packaging foam, packing peanuts, etc.)

The empty container must have a mass less than 600 grams.

A large, raw egg will be provided.

The container must free-fall (no parachutes).

No kits or pre-made designs may be used.

The structure must be the individual's invention.

The structure must land in a designated target area.

No propulsion systems will be allowed.

No gases (i.e. helium) other than air can be present in the structure when it is weighed.

The egg must survive intact (no cracks).

Methods & Analysis

Your container will be massed when empty.

An egg will be given to you.

You will then place the egg in the container, and if necessary, seal or close the container.

The container will then be taken to the height from which it will be dropped, and released.

Unless the judge declares a problem with the release, there will only be one release.

The container will remain where it lands until the judge moves and opens it.

The egg will be inspected for cracks. The decision of the judge is final.
