
Sixty-ninth Commencement Ceremony Friday, June 21, 2024 Charles & Mary Crossed Auditorium

Class of 2024, Commencement Address by Michael Mustico '90 (reprinted in full with the permission of Michael Mustico)

I would like to thank Sister Mary Walter; she is the reason Notre Dame has held strong over these many years and why ND is so respected as a high school. I know many of these students well, and I am very pleased to be speaking here today, but to say I am surprised would be an understatement

Many of you don't know that I held several records at this school: Most uniform violations, most absentee days, and most tardies. I don't know how many years those records stood, but

I am fairly certain my daughter shattered the tardy record last year!

Sister Mary Walter and I spent a lot of quality time together while I was in my record setting run. When I say a lot of time, I mean a LOT. She caught me coming in late one day and pulled me aside to go over all of my late and missed days that year. Before she had an opportunity to ask me what I had to say for myself, I proceeded to say, "Sister, we both know I don't have a whole lot going for me, other than maybe my looks, and you don't get looks like this by not getting the proper amount of beauty sleep." After what felt like a long minute of her blankly staring at me, all she could muster to say was "God Bless you child." I still don't know for sure what she meant by that.

I had a lot of failed business ideas while I was in school here. I was the original inventor of Grubhub. Most people don't know this. I quickly realized that if you teach kids under 16 to drive a car before they get their license, they can't wait for you to send them on errands. Any errands at all, as long as they get to drive a car. So after teaching my 14-year old girlfriend how to drive, I never had to leave my house for McDonalds, KFC, or Pizza Hut. I would then charge my friends for her to pick up their food as well; she would deliver it right to the school after practice.

Things were going so well that I decided to expand operations. At the time, there was only one taxi company in town, Totem Taxi. So I taught my 14-year old brother, Tony, how to drive so he could drive my friends around town, for a small fee. I called this division Totem Tony. I am still banned from Totem Taxi to this day.

Everything was great until one of my underage drivers accidentally drove my Dad's Honda Accord directly through a gazebo. Yes, I got to spend more time with Sister that week. In addition to a guest speaker from law enforcement. I spent more time in her office after I was elected Student Body Treasurer in a landslide; I should have known it wasn't a congratulatory meeting. My closing speech was right here, in this auditorium, in front of hundreds of students. I concluded by stating that we no longer had to worry about additional school fundraising - I was going to take the school's money to Las Vegas and double it! That offer still stands by the way.

Sister Carmela was my Chemistry and Physics teacher. I wasn't her favorite student. One day she pulled me aside and asked me what I was planning to do after high school. She stated that based on my performance in class I shouldn't waste my parents' money by going to college and I should strongly consider a trade school. I couldn't argue with her at that time.

Mrs. McCort was my Spanish teacher. I wasn't her most successful student. One day she asked me how I was going to pass the Regents exam. Since this was my senior year, I wouldn't be able to graduate with my class if I failed the exam. I explained to her that I had reviewed the scoring for the Regents exam, and found that vocabulary and the present tense comprised the majority of the exam, therefore if I knew that one tense well enough, I could pass with a 65 on the Regents. She asked me how I planned on passing the essay section, which entailed describing a picture they provided, if I only knew the present tense. I told her I would use the caveman essay style - "Boy is nice. Boy is happy. Boy is hungry." After she

received the exam grades, she called me personally, which I thought was a very bad sign. She waited several seconds before informing me that I passed with 67. Clearly, I had overstudied..

At this point you all are probably thinking why was this dipstick asked to speak. I am sure all the administrators are thinking that right now. Yes, see, they are nodding their heads vigorously.

Yet somehow, by the grace of God, I ended up graduating and sitting where you all sit today. And sit there, I did. They called my classmates to stand for all kinds of different academic awards for over an hour. I sat through the whole thing ... I sat for pretty much the entire commencement. I thought I had life figured out back then, until I didn't. I would eventually switch my college majors, and then switch careers, many different times as I changed my mind. Ultimately, I became a CPA who didn't do tax returns. I became an Estate Planning Attorney who didn't draft legal documents. I pretty much felt like I threw away years of my life getting degrees in professions that I didn't even enjoy.

After lobbying my wife for quite some time, she reluctantly supported me as I decided to pursue my new dream of becoming a Financial Adviser. It just so happens that over-educated professionals who can understand tax and estate planning are very useful as Financial Advisors. Now I own an investment firm and manage hundreds of millions of dollars in assets. I have clients in the majority of U.S. states and several countries. I have helped invest assets for former teachers of mine, some of who were at this very school when I wasn't at my best.

My point in sharing of all this with you is this - if some of you are sitting here, feeling like you don't have every stage of your life mapped out, or have no clue whatsoever ... you are not alone. If you feel like you have been a major screw-up and have little hope that you will amount to anything, you are not the only one.

But each time you think you know what you want out of life, put your all into it and work hard to achieve it. You can outwork people smarter than you. Trust me. Because you went to Notre Dame, I am confident you are used to working harder than most of the peers you will be competing with throughout your lives. Your ticket for life has not been punched yet, not even close. Someday, you may find things worked out better than you ever planned. Someday, you may be the person standing at this podium, speaking to a graduating class at commencement.

In the meantime, Class of 2024, God speed and God bless
