The Lenten season is a period of preparation as we anticipate Easter Sunday, a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, and spiritual reflection. At Notre Dame, it is also an opportunity for students and their families, faculty, and administration to focus their efforts on service.

Notre Dame's Campus Minister, Marie McCaig, had been made aware of a single mother who walks her 2 children to school each morning. Both children suffer from severe asthma and the school nurse frequently addresses their breathing issues upon arrival at school. After school dropoff, this mother walks to her full-time job and then walks to pick the children up after school. She pulls a wagon to the grocery store. She does not ask anyone for help and does not receive public assistance. She is an example of Elmira's working poor. She is "getting by" but the possibility of ever owning a vehicle is highly unlikely. A gift of a vehicle would open the door to a better paying job and safer housing.

On Ash Wednesday, the 2024 Lenten Project was announced - an initiative to provide a vehicle for this deserving, young mother in need. We would buy her a dependable, used vehicle, along with insurance for one (continued on next page)

With her two young children at her side, she expressed her gratitude and noted the difference this would make in her life. The Notre Dame family truly is a force to be reckoned with.

# **ALUMNI CHRONICLES**

Notre Dame High School has been an important part of my life for over 50 years. The level of importance ebbed and flowed as life has sometimes gotten in the way, but it never has gone away. I'm pretty sure it never will.

My mom and dad had grown up in Chicago and New York City and were convinced that a Catholic education was superior to the public school system. When we moved to Horseheads in 1966,

there was no question that my sister and I would attend St. Mary Our Mother elementary and Notre Dame High School. Our older siblings had attended Catholic schools exclusively from kindergarten through college.

So, in the Fall of 1969, I started my freshman year at NDHS. What I found was that the size and scale of the school was perfect for me. The academics were challenging at the correct level. There were plenty of clubs and organizations to join. There were sports teams always looking for participants. (As an 85 lb. freshman, I was never going to be a football player, but found a place in Cross Country and Track.) Even after graduation, while I was a student at Elmira College, I returned to NDHS on a regular basis and worked for several years as a volunteer Assistant Coach for the track team.

After college graduation, life interfered for a while, as it often does. I was focused on my career and family. But I always kept track of the events surrounding my alma mater. My wife and I had careers that took us from New York City to Hartford, CT, to Columbus, OH, to Dallas, TX, and finally, to Naples, FL. My wife and I both had long careers in the retail industry. I owned my own business. At one point, I became a stay-at-home Dad to a couple of kids aged 5 and 1. I got to do all the things most dads, and many moms, don't get to do. I got to be a "room father" to kids in elementary school. I got to go on field trips. I coached baseball and softball. I ran the basketball league in our town in Ohio. I served on the Finance Advisory Committee to our local School Board. I was on the Board of Directors for a local charity. I built and painted sets for the school's theater department. It was the best job/career ever! However, once they had both graduated, I had to admit I was "retired." But Notre Dame was never far away.

Now that life has slowed down, the kids are grown, and my wife and I are both retired, I have a little more time on my hands. A couple of years ago, I was asked to assist with the administration of the Notre Dame High School Alumni Facebook page. It has helped me reconnect with some great friends from 50+ years ago. It has also helped me make new friends with many others, both older and younger, who share similar feelings about NDHS. It's been invigorating to feel that enthusiasm.

If you have bothered to read this far, you have that feeling too! Notre Dame has done a great job of adapting to a changing educational environment. They have added 7th and 8th graders. They have a vibrant program for international students. They have wonderfully handled the change to a staff and administration fully comprised of laity. But they still need our help. We want Notre Dame to be the best option for students for years to come!

I encourage you all to think of ideas of ways to help NDHS continue to thrive for the next 50+ years. Sure, they will always appreciate monetary donations, but there is so much more that can be done. If you have family and friends with students approaching high school age, offer to talk to them about Notre Dame High School. If you have a talent or skill that can help, volunteer!






# Did you know?

# Notre Dame High School's legal name is Notre Dame de Lourdes High School

The Elmira Advertiser of Feb. 12, 1953 reported that "a commemorative prayer with the words 'let the little children come to me' formally launched construction of the Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic High School yesterday afternoon before an estimated gathering of more than 1,500 persons." The day celebrated "the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, who will be the patron of the school." Bishop Kearney dedicated the new school in 1955.

Notre Dame celebrates Mass each year in honor of the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes; this year's Mass was on February 9, 2024, with **Father John DeSocio '66** as celebrant.
