THE McAULEY AWARD

The McAuley Award has been presented annually since 2006. In the fall of 2018 Dick and Carol Crossed and Bishop Matthew Clark were the awardees.

Dick has worked for housing options for the poor since the late '60s and his recent contribution to the completion of the House of Mercy in Rochester was a great gift to the Sisters of Mercy. Carol is a strong advocate for life and has been an active lobbyist on hunger, pro-life and anti-war issues. Together their efforts have brought hope and love to many.



Most Reverend Matthew H. Clark

Bishop Clark served as bishop of the Rochester Diocese from June 1979 to September 2013. As Shepherd, he has been and continues to be gentle, caring, sensitive and pastoral. During his tenure as bishop he supported our schools and expanded the works of Catholic Charities. 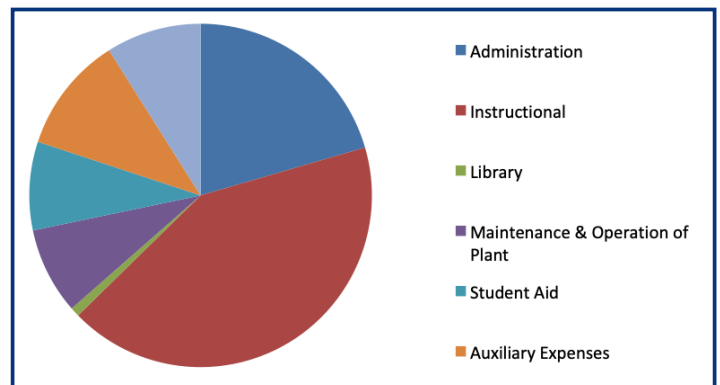
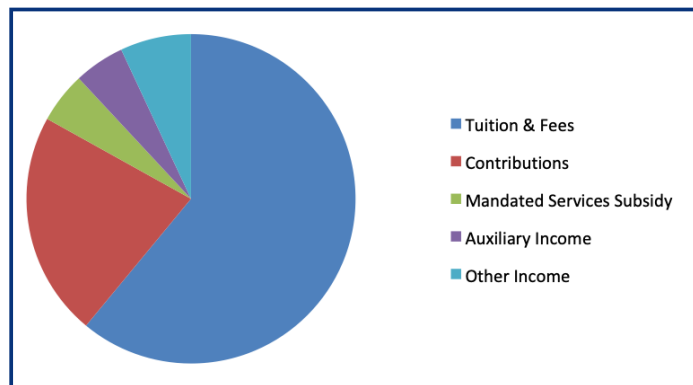

Celebrate the Success and Service of Our Students

Mercy Movement Days

Throughout the 2018-19 school year, the Notre Dame Student body served the local community through their Mercy Movement Days. High school classes spent designated days in the homes of the elderly where they cleaned, painted, manicured lawns, organized and built lasting relationships. Students also collaborated with the efforts of local organizations, such as Catholic Charities, to help provide for the poor and disadvantaged. On a beautiful fall day, the junior class traveled to a nearby town for post-flooding clean-up. In the midst of mud and mess, there were no complaints but many smiles in their accomplishments. These days of service bring awareness of local needs to our students.

On a national level, our students selected Saint Jude's Hospital as the financial benefactor of their Lenten sacrifices, with a heart-felt concern for children who suffer from cancer. The seeds of service planted at Notre Dame are rooted in mercy; mercy first, mercy always. As we considered our call to serve, we felt inspired to think beyond local and national needs. We decided to respond to a global crisis when we were informed of a small village of Mokaneh in Sierra Leone. Children in this village walked miles each

morning to locate and transport water for their daily use. Their water source was always dirty and sometimes contaminated, yet, it was all that was available. These children often became sick as they consumed this water. Our students were saddened to learn that 1 in 5 children in the region lose their lives through



the consumption of contaminated water when the solution was so simple - clean water. Hidden below the surface of the ground is life-saving, clean water. The means to access is the installation of a \$5,000 water well. Without hesitation, and with great enthusiasm, our staff, faculty and student

body “adopted” this tiny village, and within weeks, raised the necessary funds to drill for the clean water and to install the water pump. In June, we were blessed to share this photo of our children, in our village of Mokaneh, enjoying their fresh water provided through our water well! This little African village is both far away and yet so close. Hearts have been changed through this experience of bringing merciful compassion to our brothers and sisters in their greatest need. May our Lord bless our students in their continued service. And may our students never underestimate their ability to make a difference through their service.

Community Kitchen

Following in the footsteps of Catherine McAuley, our ministry at the Elmira Community Kitchen enables students and staff to serve the poor in a very personal way. On the first Wednesday of every month, ND students and staff provide, prepare, and serve our signature dishes of chicken and vegetable stew, cornbread, and usually peach crisp. By working closely with our hosts and chef, Joe and Lynn, and the dishwashers and cleaners, we have made friends we would most likely not have met otherwise. Many in the ND community have joined together to keep this ministry going.

This year, at the Catholic Charities Works of Love Dinner, Notre Dame was happy to honor two of our most steadfast volunteers, senior Rebecca Shannon and her mother, our registrar, Tina Shannon. Rebecca has worked every month with us for her junior and senior years, baking, serving, and especially growing in her care and concern for the individuals who come to the kitchen. Truly the Community Kitchen allows students to see the poor as persons with joys, worries, and distinct personalities. When the kitchen had a major flood in the winter of her senior year, Rebecca was adamant that we serve anyway—pizzas to the rescue. We celebrated Rebecca's graduation with our guests, having ice cream sundaes with all the trimmings as our dessert. Our guests gave Rebecca a sendoff

with applause, smiles, and a giant thank you. Students from 7th grade and up are all welcome to help; we are proud that most return time and again.

Besides meal prep and serving every month, Tina Shannon has joined in with the Community Kitchen campaign to care for the Earth by eliminating disposables. She collects used mugs, ice cream scoops, and other kitchen ware and brings it to the kitchen. She also is determined to have our meals be as healthy as possible, so she chops vegetables and sneaks them into our chicken stew. Tina Shannon loves to work at the serving window, welcoming each guest individually and making sure they are served just what they like.

Mrs. Jennings brought the Community Kitchen ministry to ND from Holy Family, along with the 7th and 8th graders. We pay for the food we serve from the “gently used uniform sale”, thus involving even more members of the ND family. Of course, donations are always welcome. We hope that, with the help of our whole Notre Dame family, we will be able to continue in this

ministry to help the poor and to give our students the chance to meet the people who are the poor of our community. The Community Kitchen Ministry is just one of the many ways that ND grows students' hearts.



Golden Mass



Notre Dame continues to celebrate Christmas with the Golden Mass, and we continue to witness the generosity and compassion of our students who understand that the child who was given to us as Savior calls us to be givers. Last December, a recent alumna contacted Mrs. McCaig to ask if she could help in sponsoring one of our Crusader Christmas program families. She further explained that her parents made great sacrifices in order to send her to Notre Dame, and that, in fact, they were quite poor. She shared that because she had experienced poverty, she understood the value of

our students providing food and Christmas gifts to families in need. Our students continue to see this sacred and holy season for what it truly represents. Like the infant Christ, our school community seeks to bring love, peace, and joy to a world that is not so much different than the one of nearly 2000 years ago: a world in need.

From the Robotics Department

Notre Dame's FIRST Robotics Team 3799 Electric Fire chalked up another successful year! This year's competition, Destination Deep Space, commemorated the 50th anniversary of the moon landing. The team put in many long hours during the six weeks of build season conceptualizing, prototyping, designing, building, debugging and testing the robot. In the nine years since its inception, this year was the first time the team competed at two regional competitions in the same season. It was also the first year the team used electronic tablets for capturing critical scouting data on the other teams during the competition.

The first regional competition was the New York Tech Valley Regional held at RPI in Troy, New York, from March 7-9 where the team competed against 36 other teams

and won The Gracious Professionalism Award. Sponsored by Johnson and Johnson, this award recognizes outstanding demonstration of FIRST Core Values such as continuous Gracious Professionalism, working together both on and off the field of play. The team was also the runner up for the Safety Award at RPI.



The second competition was the Finger Lakes Regional held at RIT in Henrietta, New York, from March 14-16

where they competed against 49 teams from across New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Canada, Brazil and China. This year's robot proved to be a highly reliable design that competed in each of the assigned qualifying matches. The school is very proud of the graduating seniors who have contributed significantly to the success of the team over the years they have been involved.

From the Music Department

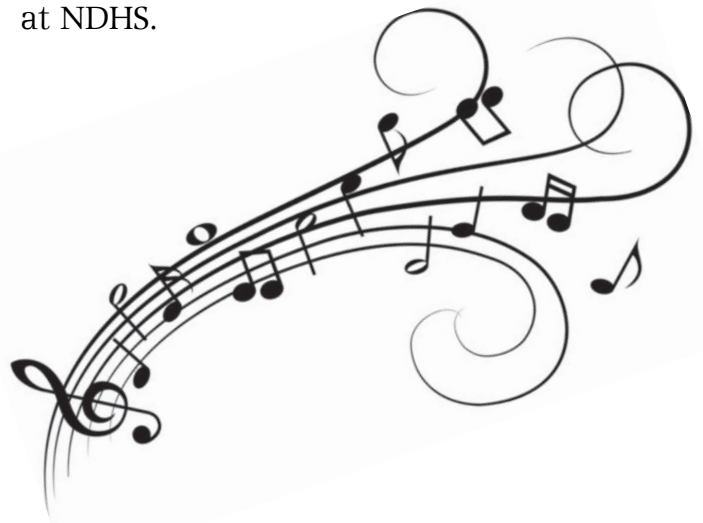

Second, the full current market value qualifies as a charitable contribution deduction.

Matching Gifts

Planned Giving

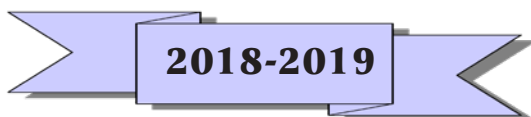
