

As a 2007 graduate of Notre Dame High School, I feel very fortunate to have had a wonderful high school experience filled with many fond memories. Reflecting on my experience at Notre Dame, I now recognize how many important life lessons I learned during those four years as well as a few realizations I wish I had known back then!

One of my greatest passions was discovered during my time at Notre Dame. Throughout my senior year, I was focused on taking photos and videos of my classmates. I have footage of all the big milestones we experienced that year because I didn't want to miss or forget anything. It was during that senior year that I discovered my love of documenting and storytelling which I

continue to do today in my professional career as a photographer.

Some people know from an early age what career path they want to follow, but that was not the case for me. I went to college because that seemed like the logical next step, but I had little direction regarding what I wanted to study. Art was always my favorite subject in school, so I knew I was most likely to land a career in the creative industry. I attended the Rochester Institute of Technology and graduated with a BFA in Graphic Design. That degree translated into me working as a graphic designer for a Pittsburgh-based advertising agency where I am still employed a decade later. In addition to design, I am also a freelance photographer and abstract painter. I love that I can build a professional career combining three different creative avenues rather than focusing on one specific medium.

Society puts a lot of pressure on high school students to pick a direction and know what they want to do when they "grow up". In my opinion, the emphasis should be placed on welcoming different experiences to better understand who we truly are. Only then can we make decisions that align with our values and ultimately lead us to live happy and fulfilled lives.

Perhaps the most significant lesson I learned at Notre Dame is the importance of having community in your life. Attending a small school, in a small town, where you know the names of everyone in your graduating class is a unique experience - one that at the time I took for granted. To this day, when I run into people from high school, I still feel a sense of connection with them even if we haven't spoken in years. We are part of a community and that is something that will never change no matter the time or distance.

Notre Dame provided me with a solid foundation to build upon. Looking back on everything that has happened since walking across that graduation stage in 2007, I can honestly say I am both proud of the person I am today and look forward to meeting the person I will be in the future. What would I tell my recently graduated, seventeen-year-old self? There is beauty in uncertainty. You don't always need to know where the path is going to take you as long as you have faith in knowing you will end up where you are supposed to be. Stay open to experiences, people, ideas, and culture for they will teach you something more valuable than anything found in the pages of a textbook.

I am so grateful for my years at Notre Dame and will always be proud to call myself a Crusader.

Robert Johnson '58 was recently honored by the United States Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA) for his continued support of the USMMA and his contributions to the Maritime Industry. Following graduation from Notre Dame, Bob had the option to attend The University of Rochester to study Chemical Engineering or to commit to the appointment he received to USMMA. He chose to attend the Academy for several reasons, one being the attraction of Sea Year, a training period completed in two parts during a cadet's sophomore and junior years. During Bob's Sea Year, he traveled with American Export Lines to what was then called the "Romance Run", the southern Mediterranean, Portugal, Spain, France, Turkey, Greece, Cyprus, and some of the Greek Islands. The remaining time was spent traveling with United States lines to northern Europe, Germany, France, and a number of Nordic countries. He also had the opportunity to travel to Tunisia, Morocco, and Israel. Bob graduated from USMMA in 1962 as a Licensed Third Mate and immediately set sail to West and South Africa with Farrell Steamship Lines. Within two years, he rose to Second Mate during the height of the Apartheid in South Africa. He later served as an Assistant Port Captain with American President Lines in San Francisco, CA, where he was in charge of ship logistics in the Bay area ports of San Francisco, Oakland, Stockton, and Sacramento. During this time, he obtained his Doctorate in Jurisprudence from Lincoln University and was admitted to the California State Bar in 1974. Currently, Bob is enjoying his retirement in Houston, TX.





CLIMATE CRUSADERS




